Texas Health and Safety Code and Texas Water Code
Settlement Notice

The State of Texas gives notice of the following proposed resolution of an environmental enforcement action under the Texas Water Code. Before the State may enter into a voluntary settlement agreement, pursuant to §7.110 of the Texas Water Code the State shall permit the public to comment in writing. The Attorney General will consider any written comments and may withdraw or withhold consent to the proposed agreement if the comments disclose facts or considerations indicating that consent is inappropriate, improper, inadequate, or inconsistent with the requirements of the law.

Case Title and Court: *Harris County, Texas, and the State of Texas, Acting by and through the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, a Necessary and Indispensable Party v. Texas Industrial Box Maintenance, Inc.*; Cause No. 2014-35385; in the 190th Judicial District Court of Harris County, Texas.

Background: Defendant Texas Industrial Box Maintenance, Inc. owns and operates an industrial tank cleaning facility located at 15331 Market Street, Channelview, Harris County, Texas. Since 2004, the facility has repeatedly emitted strong, pungent, chemical odors that seriously affect the health and safety of the neighborhood. In addition, the facility discharged unauthorized industrial wastewater onto the ground in 2014, which commingled with storm water and flowed into a nearby ditch. Defendant has allegedly violated the Texas Water Code, the Texas Health and Safety Code, Texas Clean Air Act, TCEQ rules, and the Harris County Storm Water Regulations.

Proposed Settlement: Since the filing of the lawsuit in 2014, Defendant has attempted to change its operational procedures to eliminate the odors emanating from the facility. The parties propose an Agreed Final Judgment and Permanent Injunction, which orders the Defendant to, among other things, cease the discharge of wastewater, properly store and seal the containers at the facility, conduct daily odor surveys, maintain daily logs, and maintain detailed operational records of all containers accepted and cleaned. The proposed settlement also awards Harris County and the State \$71,851.26 in civil penalties, to be equally divided between Harris County and the State, and awards the State's reasonable attorney's fees in the amount of \$5,600.

The Office of the Attorney General will accept written comments relating to the proposed judgment for thirty (30) days from the date of publication of this notice. The proposed judgment may be examined at the Office of the Attorney General, 300 W. 15th Street, 10th Floor, Austin, Texas, and copies may be obtained in person or by mail for the cost of copying. Texas Water Code and Texas Health and Safety Code
Settlement Notice

Notice is hereby given by the State of Texas of the following proposed resolution of an environmental enforcement lawsuit under the Texas Water Code and the Texas Health & Safety Code. Before the State may settle a judicial enforcement action under the Texas Water Code, the State shall permit the public to comment in writing on the proposed judgment. The Attorney General will consider any written comments and may withdraw or withhold consent to the proposed judgment if the comments disclose facts or considerations that include that the consent is inappropriate, improper, inadequate, or inconsistent with the requirements of the Texas Water Code and the Texas Health & Safety Code.

Case Title and Court: *State of Texas v. Post Oak Grinding, LLC d/b/a Green Choice Organics*; Cause No. D-1-GV-12-000806, in the 261st Judicial District Court, Travis County, Texas.

Nature of the Defendant's Operations: Post Oak Grinding, LLC stores and processes yard clippings, brush, lumber, discarded produce and other food waste in the operation of its composting facility in Dallas County. The facility included a pond used to store leachate resulting from rainwater percolating through the piles of composting materials. The State alleged that the Defendant failed to comply with a TCEQ administrative order and TCEQ rules regarding the operation of composting facilities, including maintaining adequate financial assurance, maintaining records that show at least 50% of material was composted or removed on a six-month basis, and operating the leachate storage pond without authorization.

Proposed Agreed Judgment: The Agreed Final Judgment and Permanent Injunction orders Defendant investigate the site of the retention pond for any contamination and take action to remediate the site if the investigation reveals any contamination. The Judgment awards the State of Texas civil penalties of \$20,500 and \$5,000 in attorney's fees.

Agreed Orders

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ, agency, or commission) staff is providing an opportunity for written public comment on the listed Agreed Orders (AOs) in accordance with Texas Water Code (TWC), §7.075. TWC, §7.075 requires that before the commission may approve the AOs, the commission shall allow the public an opportunity to submit written comments on the proposed AOs. Reservoir 1 has a surface area of 1.15 acres and a normal capacity of 5.75 acre-feet. A point on the centerline of the dam is located at N 38°E, 5,800 feet from the southwest corner of the T & P RR Survey, also being at Latitude 32.811850°N, Longitude 97.579933°W.

Reservoir 2 has a surface area of 0.65 acres and a normal capacity of 3.25 acre-feet. A point on the centerline of the dam is located at N 47°E, 5,500 feet from the southwest corner of the T & P RR Survey, also being at Latitude 32.810683°N, Longitude 97.578500°W.

Reservoir 3 has a surface area of 0.29 acres and a normal capacity of 1.45 acre-feet. A point on the centerline of the dam is located at N 26°E, 3,000 feet from the southwest corner of the T & P RR Survey, also being at Latitude 32.808333°N, Longitude 97.581817°W.

Reservoir 4 has a surface area of 0.31 acres and a normal capacity of 1.55 acre-feet. A point on the centerline of the dam is located at N 39°E, 3,300 feet from the southwest corner of the T & P RR Survey, also being at Latitude 32.808200°N, Longitude 97.580767°W.

Reservoir 5 has a surface area of 0.36 acres and a normal capacity of 1.8 acre-feet. A point on the centerline of the dam is located at N 52°E, 3,600 feet from the southwest corner of the T & P RR Survey, also being at Latitude 32.807983°N, Longitude 97.579750°W.

Reservoir 6 has a surface area of 1.15 acres and a normal capacity of 5.75 acre-feet. A point on the centerline of the dam is located at N 64°E, 3,200 feet from the southwest corner of the T & P RR Survey, also being at Latitude 32.805933°N, Longitude 97.580833°W.

Reservoir 7 has a surface area of 2.0 acres and a normal capacity of 10.0 acre-feet. A point on the centerline of the dam is located at N 64°E, 4,200 feet from the southwest corner of the T & P RR Survey, also being at Latitude 32.807317°N, Longitude 97.578050°W.

Applicant has provided evidence of an alternate source of water, being groundwater from the Paluxy Formation of the Trinity Aquifer, to maintain the reservoirs at a constant level. Applicant indicates evaporation losses to be 27.6 acre-feet per year while the five existing ground-

water wells are capable of producing a combined total of 90.33 acre-feet of water per year at a maximum combined rate of 0.1114 cfs (50 gpm). Applicant proposes that groundwater from these five wells will be discharged into five of the seven reservoirs.

The five groundwater discharge points are described as follows:

Discharge Point 1 will discharge into Reservoir 1 at a point bearing N 38°E, 5,800 feet from the southwest corner of the T & P RR Survey, also being at Latitude 32.811850°N, Longitude 97.579933°W.

Discharge Point 2 will discharge into Reservoir 2 at a point bearing N 47°E, 5,500 feet from the southwest corner of the T & P RR Survey, also being at Latitude 32.810683°N, Longitude 97.578500°W.

Discharge Point 3 will discharge into Reservoir 3 at a point bearing N 26°E, 3,000 feet from the southwest corner of the T & P RR Survey, also being at Latitude 32.808333°N, Longitude 97.581817°W.

Discharge Point 6 will discharge into Reservoir 6 at a point bearing N 64°E, 3,200 feet from the southwest corner of the T & P RR Survey, also being at Latitude 32.805933°N, Longitude 97.580833°W.

Discharge Point 7 will discharge into Reservoir 7 at a point bearing N 64°E, 4,200 feet from the southwest corner of the T & P RR Survey, also being at Latitude 32.807317°N, Longitude 97.578050°W.

Applicant indicates water discharged into Reservoir 3 will be sufficient to maintain Reservoirs 3, 4, and 5 full and to allow all inflows to pass downstream.

Applicant indicates that all reservoirs and discharge points are located in zip code 78108.

The seven reservoirs partially inundate 24 land owners. Each land owner has provided written consent and the deeds to their land. Ownership of the lands to be inundated is evidenced with Document Nos. 631690, 672537, 495535, 519893, 699473, 534334, 480974, 473241, 549906, 645666, 691315, 578237, 570813, 488720, 626960, 636995, 481189, 597585, 600434, 620690, 524222, 560153, 652860, and 669289 as recorded in the Official Records of Parker County.

This proposal should identify how the vendor would (1) work with UHS faculty and staff to identify UHS's state priorities; (2) develop and implement a plan for assisting UHS with obtaining state funding for research activities; (3) advise UHS regarding state requirements and compliance related to grants; (4) monitor and report on grant opportunities and developments regarding laws and policies that may impact UHS; and (5) raise the visibility of UHS in Texas with lawmakers and state departments and agencies. (6) UHS also will require 10 hours of pro bono legal services annually at the direction of UHS General Counsel.

Finding by Chief Executive Officer, Renu Khator:

After reviewing the current status and discussing this matter with the staff, the evaluation of these services can only be conducted by a firm considered expert in state legislative matters, the holistic expertise for this service is not part of the competencies of employees at the University. Thus, it is necessary for the University to engage a consultant to advise on state legislative matters, and make recommendations, as appropriate.

Review and Award Criteria:

All proposals will be evaluated by appointed representatives of the University in accordance with the following procedures:

1. Purchasing will receive and review each RFP proposal to ensure it meets the requirements of the RFP. Qualified proposals will be given to the selection committee.
2. Each member of the selection committee will independently evaluate the qualified proposals according to the criteria in section IX of the

RFP, except for price, and send their evaluations to Purchasing. Price will be evaluated by Purchasing.

3. Purchasing will combine the committee's scores to determine which proposal received the highest combined score.

4. Purchasing will notify the respondent with the highest score that the University intends to contract with them.

Deadlines: UH must receive proposals according to instructions in the RFP package on or before Monday, September 12, 2016 at 2:00 p.m. CDT.

E. Serial Number - A unique 13 (thirteen) digit number appearing under the latex scratch-off covering on the front of the Scratch Ticket. The Serial Number is for validation purposes and cannot be used to play the game. The format will be: 0000000000000.

F. Low-Tier Prize - A prize of \$5.00, \$10.00 or \$20.00.

G. Mid-Tier Prize - A prize of \$25.00, \$50.00, \$100, \$250 or \$500.

H. High-Tier Prize - A prize of \$1,000, \$10,000 or \$100,000.

I. Bar Code - A 24 (twenty-four) character interleaved two (2) of five (5) Bar Code which will include a four (4) digit game ID, the seven (7) digit Pack number, the three (3) digit Scratch Ticket number and the ten (10) digit Validation Number. The Bar Code appears on the back of the Scratch Ticket.

M. Scratch Game Ticket, Scratch Ticket or Ticket - Texas Lottery "\$100,000 CASH" Scratch Ticket Game No. 1811.

2.0 Determination of Prize Winners. The determination of prize winners is subject to the general Scratch Ticket validation requirements set forth in Texas Lottery Rule 401.302, Instant Game Rules, these Game Procedures, and the requirements set out on each Scratch Ticket. A prize winner in the "\$100,000 CASH" Scratch Ticket Game is determined once the latex on the Scratch Ticket is scratched off to expose 57 (fifty-seven) Play Symbols. The "Key Number Match" game on the Scratch Ticket Front has 45 (forty-five) Play Symbols, and the "Find" game on the Scratch Ticket Back has 12 (twelve) Play Symbols. Play Instructions for "Key Number Match" game - Scratch Ticket Front: If a player matches any of YOUR NUMBERS Play Symbols to any of

the WINNING NUMBERS Play Symbols, the player wins the PRIZE for that number. If a player reveals a "5X" Play Symbol, the player wins 5 TIMES the PRIZE for that symbol. If a player reveals a "\$50 BURST" Play Symbol, the player wins \$50 instantly! Play Instructions for "Find" game - Scratch Ticket Back: If a player reveals a "DOLLAR BILL" Play Symbol, the player wins the PRIZE for that symbol. If a player reveals a "2X" Play Symbol, the player wins DOUBLE the PRIZE for that symbol. No portion of the Display Printing nor any extraneous matter whatsoever shall be usable or playable as a part of the Scratch Ticket.

2.1 Scratch Ticket Validation Requirements.

A. To be a valid Scratch Ticket, all of the following requirements must be met:

1. Exactly 57 (fifty-seven) Play Symbols must appear under the Latex Overprint on the Scratch Ticket. "Key Number Match" on the Scratch Ticket Front has 45 (forty-five) Play Symbols, and "Find" on the Scratch Ticket Back has 12 (twelve) Play Symbols.
2. Each of the Play Symbols must have a Play Symbol Caption underneath, unless specified, and each Play Symbol must agree with its Play Symbol Caption;
3. Each of the Play Symbols must be present in its entirety and be fully legible;
4. Each of the Play Symbols must be printed in black ink except for dual image games;
5. The Scratch Ticket shall be intact;
6. The Serial Number, Retailer Validation Code and Pack-Scratch Ticket Number must be present in their entirety and be fully legible;
7. The Serial Number must correspond, using the Texas Lottery's codes, to the Play Symbols on the Scratch Ticket;
8. The Scratch Ticket must not have a hole punched through it, be mutilated, altered, unreadable, reconstituted or tampered with in any manner;
9. The Scratch Ticket must not be counterfeit in whole or in part;
10. The Scratch Ticket must have been issued by the Texas Lottery in an authorized manner;
11. The Scratch Ticket must not have been stolen, nor appear on any list of omitted Scratch Tickets or non-activated Scratch Tickets on file at the Texas Lottery;

12. The Play Symbols, Serial Number, Retailer Validation Code and Pack-Scratch Ticket Number must be right side up and not reversed in any manner;

13. The Scratch Ticket must be complete and not miscut, and have exactly 57 (fifty-seven) Play Symbols under the Latex Overprint on the Scratch Ticket. The "Key Number Match" game on the Scratch Ticket Front has 45 (forty-five) Play Symbols, and the "Find" game on the Scratch Ticket Back has 12 (twelve) Play Symbols. The Play Symbols will appear under the Latex Overprint on the front and back portion of the Scratch Ticket, exactly one Serial Number, exactly one Retailer Validation Code, and exactly one Pack-Scratch Ticket Number on the Scratch Ticket;

14. The Serial Number of an apparent winning Scratch Ticket shall correspond with the Texas Lottery's Serial Numbers for winning Scratch Tickets, and a Scratch Ticket with that Serial Number shall not have been paid previously;

15. The Scratch Ticket must not be blank or partially blank, misregistered, defective or printed or produced in error;

16. Each of the 57 (fifty-seven) Play Symbols on the Scratch Ticket must be exactly one of those described in §1.2.C of these Game Procedures;

17. Each of the 57 (fifty-seven) Play Symbols on the Scratch Ticket must be printed in the Symbol font and must correspond precisely to the artwork on file at the Texas Lottery; the Scratch Ticket Serial Numbers must be printed in the Serial font and must correspond precisely to the artwork on file at the Texas Lottery; and the Pack-Scratch Ticket Number must be printed in the Pack-Scratch Ticket Number font and must correspond precisely to the artwork on file at the Texas Lottery;

18. The Display Printing on the Scratch Ticket must be regular in every respect and correspond precisely to the artwork on file at the Texas Lottery; and

19. The Scratch Ticket must have been received by the Texas Lottery by applicable deadlines.

B. The Scratch Ticket must pass all additional validation tests provided for in these Game Procedures, the Texas Lottery's Rules governing the award of prizes of the amount to be validated, and any confidential validation and security tests of the Texas Lottery.

C. Any Scratch Ticket not passing all of the validation requirements is void and ineligible for any prize and shall not be paid. However, the Executive Director may, solely at the Executive Director's discretion, refund the retail sales price of the Scratch Ticket. In the event a defective Scratch Ticket is purchased, the only responsibility or liability of the Texas Lottery shall be to replace the defective Scratch Ticket with another unplayed Scratch Ticket in that Scratch Ticket Game (or a Scratch Ticket of equivalent sales price from any other current Texas Lottery Scratch Ticket Game) or refund the retail sales price of the Scratch Ticket, solely at the Executive Director's discretion.

2.2 Programmed Game Parameters.

A. GENERAL: Consecutive Non-Winning Tickets in a Pack will not have matching play data, spot for spot.

B. GENERAL: The top Prize Symbol will appear on every Ticket unless restricted by other parameters, play action or prize structure.

C. KEY NUMBER MATCH - TICKET FRONT: No matching non-winning YOUR NUMBERS Play Symbols on a Ticket.

D. KEY NUMBER MATCH - TICKET FRONT: No matching WINNING NUMBERS Play Symbols on a Ticket.

E. KEY NUMBER MATCH - TICKET FRONT: The "\$50" burst (WIN\$50) Play Symbol will only appear on intended winning Tickets as dictated by the prize structure and will only appear with the \$50 Prize Symbol.

F. KEY NUMBER MATCH - TICKET FRONT: The "5X" (WINX5) Play Symbol will only appear on intended winning Tickets as dictated by the prize structure.

G. KEY NUMBER MATCH - TICKET FRONT: No prize amount in a non-winning spot will correspond with the YOUR NUMBERS Play Symbol (i.e., 10 and \$10).

H. KEY NUMBER MATCH - TICKET FRONT: A non-winning Prize Symbol will never be the same as a winning Prize Symbol in this game.

I. KEY NUMBER MATCH - TICKET FRONT: A Ticket may have up to three (3) matching non-winning Prize Symbols unless restricted by other parameters, play action or prize structure.

J. FIND - TICKET BACK: No win(s) will appear in this game unless there is at least one (1) win in the Key Number Match (Ticket front) game.

K. FIND - TICKET BACK: No matching non-winning Play Symbols in this game.

L. FIND - TICKET BACK: No matching non-winning Prize Symbols in this game.

M. FIND - TICKET BACK: A non-winning Prize Symbol will never be the same as a winning Prize Symbol in this game.

N. FIND - TICKET BACK: The "2X" (DOUBLE) Play Symbol will only appear as dictated by the prize structure.

2.3 Procedure for Claiming Prizes.

A. To claim a "\$100,000 CASH" Scratch Ticket Game prize of \$5.00, \$10.00, \$20.00, \$25.00, \$50.00, \$100, \$250 or \$500, a claimant shall sign the back of the Scratch Ticket in the space designated on the Scratch Ticket and present the winning Scratch Ticket to any Texas Lottery Retailer. The Texas Lottery Retailer shall verify the claim and, if valid, and upon presentation of proper identification, if appropriate, make payment of the amount due the claimant and physically void the Scratch Ticket; provided that the Texas Lottery Retailer may, but is not required, to pay a \$25.00, \$50.00, \$100, \$250 or \$500 Scratch Ticket Game. In the event the Texas Lottery Retailer cannot verify the claim, the Texas Lottery Retailer shall provide the claimant with a claim form and instruct the claimant on how to file a claim with the Texas Lottery. If the claim is validated by the Texas Lottery, a check shall be forwarded to the claimant in the amount due. In the event the claim is not validated, the claim shall be denied and the claimant shall be notified promptly. A claimant may also claim any of the above prizes under the procedure described in §2.3.B and §2.3.C of these Game Procedures.

B. To claim a "\$100,000 CASH" Scratch Ticket Game prize of \$1,000, \$10,000 or \$100,000, the claimant must sign the winning Scratch Ticket and present it at one of the Texas Lottery's Claim Centers. If the claim is validated by the Texas Lottery, payment will be made to the bearer of the validated winning Scratch Ticket for that prize upon presentation of proper identification. When paying a prize of \$600 or more, the Texas Lottery shall file the appropriate income reporting form with the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) and shall withhold federal income tax at a rate set by the IRS if required. In the event that the claim is not validated by the Texas Lottery, the claim shall be denied and the claimant shall be notified promptly.

C. As an alternative method of claiming a "\$100,000 CASH" Scratch Ticket Game prize, the claimant must sign the winning Scratch Ticket, thoroughly complete a claim form, and mail both to: Texas Lottery

Commission, P.O. Box 16600, Austin, Texas 78761-6600. The Texas Lottery is not responsible for Scratch Tickets lost in the mail. In the event that the claim is not validated by the Texas Lottery, the claim shall be denied and the claimant shall be notified promptly.

D. Prior to payment by the Texas Lottery of any prize, the Texas Lottery shall deduct:

1. A sufficient amount from the winnings of a prize winner who has been finally determined to be:

a. delinquent in the payment of a tax or other money to a state agency and that delinquency is reported to the Comptroller under Government Code §403.055;

b. in default on a loan made under Chapter 52, Education Code; or

c. in default on a loan guaranteed under Chapter 57, Education Code; and

2. delinquent child support payments from the winnings of a prize winner in the amount of the delinquency as determined by a court or a Title IV-D agency under Chapter 231, Family Code.

E. If a person is indebted or owes delinquent taxes to the State, other than those specified in the preceding paragraph, the winnings of a person shall be withheld until the debt or taxes are paid.

2.4 Allowance for Delay of Payment. The Texas Lottery may delay payment of the prize pending a final determination by the Executive Director, under any of the following circumstances:

A. if a dispute occurs, or it appears likely that a dispute may occur, regarding the prize;

B. if there is any question regarding the identity of the claimant;

C. if there is any question regarding the validity of the Scratch Ticket presented for payment; or

D. if the claim is subject to any deduction from the payment otherwise due, as described in §2.3.D of these Game Procedures. No liability for interest for any delay shall accrue to the benefit of the claimant pending payment of the claim.

2.5 Payment of Prizes to Persons Under 18. If a person under the age of 18 years is entitled to a cash prize under \$600 from the "\$100,000 CASH" Scratch Ticket Game, the Texas Lottery shall deliver to an adult member of the minor's family or the minor's guardian a check or warrant in the amount of the prize payable to the order of the minor.

2.6 If a person under the age of 18 years is entitled to a cash prize of \$600 or more from the "\$100,000 CASH" Scratch Ticket Game, the Texas Lottery shall deposit the amount of the prize in a custodial bank account, with an adult member of the minor's family or the minor's guardian serving as custodian for the minor.

2.7 Scratch Ticket Claim Period. All Scratch Ticket prizes must be claimed within 180 days following the end of the Scratch Ticket Game or within the applicable time period for certain eligible military personnel as set forth in Texas Government Code §466.408. Any rights to a prize that is not claimed within that period, and in the manner specified in these Game Procedures and on the back of each Scratch Ticket, shall be forfeited.

2.8 Disclaimer. The number of prizes in a game is approximate based on the number of Scratch Tickets ordered. The number of actual prizes available in a game may vary based on number of Scratch Tickets manufactured, testing, distribution, sales and number of prizes claimed. A Scratch Ticket Game may continue to be sold even when all the top prizes have been claimed.

3.0 Scratch Ticket Ownership.

A. Until such time as a signature is placed upon the back portion of a Scratch Ticket in the space designated, a Scratch Ticket shall be owned by the physical possessor of said Scratch Ticket. When a signature is placed on the back of the Scratch Ticket in the space designated, the player whose signature appears in that area shall be the owner of the Scratch Ticket and shall be entitled to any prize attributable thereto. Notwithstanding any name or names submitted on a claim form, the Executive Director shall make payment to the player whose signature appears on the back of the Scratch Ticket in the space designated. If more than one name appears on the back of the Scratch Ticket, the Executive Director will require that one of those players whose name appears thereon be designated by such players to receive payment.

B. The Texas Lottery shall not be responsible for lost or stolen Scratch Tickets and shall not be required to pay on a lost or stolen Scratch Ticket.

4.0 Number and Value of Scratch Prizes. There will be approximately 8,040,000 Scratch Tickets in Scratch Ticket Game No. 1811. The approximate number and value of prizes in the game are as follows:

This is a notice of an opportunity for public comment and a public hearing on an application by Morris Killough and Chance Dean for a Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) permit to excavate 4,000 cubic yards of sand and gravel from the Sabinal River approximately 2,000 feet downstream of the F.M. 1050 crossing and 3.8 miles upstream of the F.M. 187 crossing in Uvalde County.

The hearing will be held at 11:00 a.m. on September 9, 2016 at TPWD headquarters, located at 4200 Smith School Road, Austin, Texas 78744. The hearing is not a contested case hearing under the Administrative Procedure Act.
